




## SNA EARTHQUAKE RESPONSE - SITREP #2 for MAY 2023




## **EDUCATION**


- During May 2023, SNA members reported successful implementation of education programs in Idleb and Aleppo. Reporting members reached 8,341 new children (4,787 Boys, 3,554 Girls) across several age groups and 428,760 repeated children (218,114 Boys, 210,646 Girls).
- The activities took place in 184 schools and 52 camps.
- The primary modality of the project activities was in-classroom, providing Formal and Non-formal education.
- The main recipients of these services were internally displaced persons (IDPs), accounting for 212,037 individuals, followed by host community members (38,993) and individuals from mixed backgrounds (175,613).
- The level of education provided spanned from lower to upper secondary levels and included both formal and non-formal education.



### Number of beneficiaries varied by age and gender, with the new and repeated beneficiaries



















## **PROTECTION**


- SNA members responses are categorized under the Areas of Responsibilities (AoR) umbrella: Child protection, Protection, Gender-based violence (GBV), and Mine Action (MA), They have carried out activities such as community-based child protection, including psychosocial support and parenting programmes (CP and protection), awareness raising activities (GBV), and Victim Assistance (MA).
- SNA members have reached a total of 129.393 beneficiaries through protection activities during May. The main beneficiaries include a combination of IDPs and host communities.
- Support provided in response to the recent earthquake reached 20,622 beneficiaries (15.9% of total reached). Main activities were awareness raising activities, dignity kits distribution, psychosocial support, and in-kind materials assistance.
- In addition to activities targeting communities, members have provided protection services in 16 collective shelters, ensuring that the needs of the displaced and the homeless are not overlooked.








## NUTRITION

- Interventions aimed at addressing severe acute malnutrition (SAM) and moderate acute malnutrition (MAM) among boys and girls. Further, programming included referrals to health facilities for advanced care.
- Services were delivered at health facilities as well as via Rapid Response Teams, focusing primarily on screening & referral, Infant and Young Child Feeding (IYCF), Micronutrients Supplementation, Community Management of Acute Malnutrition (CMAM) and various nutrition-related activities.
- The project also provided support to pregnant and lactating women (PLW), tackling MAM among them and referring those with MAM for further assistance. The interventions reached 6,594 pregnant women and 8,339 lactating women.
- Progress was noted in the number of recoveries, with 415 males and 1,290 females reported as having improved nutrition status. Despite the advances, challenges were also encountered with 1 male fatality and a number of beneficiaries defaulting or not recovering as expected.
