
SNA EARTHQUAKE RESPONSE - SITREP#13 for December 2023

This report details the humanitarian responses of the Syrian NGO Alliance (SNA) members during October 2023, encompassing both the general response and the post-earthquake response. The report focuses on three sectors: Food Security and Livelihoods (FSL), Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH), and Early Recovery. 


FOOD SECURITY & LIVELIHOODS (FSL)

- In October, members of the SNA effectively reached a wide array of beneficiaries through their FSL interventions, catering to various groups such as adults, children, individuals with disabilities, and female-headed households.
- **208009** households were reached encompassing 1035761 individuals. assistance.. **944197** of these individuals were unique to the month of September while, the rest had received similar assistance in the previous month.
- Beneficiaries reached included 89% Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) and 11% mix of Host Communities & IDPs.
- To ensure that assistance provided aligned with the specific needs and contexts of the beneficiaries, both in-kind services and cash/voucher aid were utilized.




Total Beneficiarie by Delivery Modality

EARLY RECOVERY

- SNA members conducted Early Recovery projects in 71 communities in Idleb and Aleppo Governorates.
- SNA members reached and assisted 2415346 new beneficiaries (directly and indirectly) during October 2023.
- Early Recovery projects have reached a total of 3213651 individuals, including 2400592 individuals benefiting from the Earthquake Response initiative, 15666 people reached through activities under Maintenance and Improvement of Equitable Access to Basic Services, 22337 individuals benefiting from enhanced access to Livelihoods and Job Opportunities and 162 individuals
- benefiting from strengthen social cohesion by empowering communities to lead early recovery processes together.

An additional 2785069 indirect beneficiaries benefitted from the overall improved conditions and infrastructure stemming from early recovery projects such as the rehabilitation of local markets/warehouses, road rehabilitation.


WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE (WASH)


- SNA members responded to WASH needs and implemented WASH projects in 415 camps and 5 collective centers. Through the water infrastructure projects, SNA members reached 24.639in water network rehab, 558,494 in operation and maintenance of water stations, and 512,550 through the chlorination of water.
- As most camps depend on water trucking, the members responded through water-trucking to 708.381 people and distributed 686 water containers.

In addition, and as response to cholera outbreak, the members distributed hygiene kits to 56.113 people and conducted hygiene promotion sessions to 39.094 people.

- The members responded by sustainable intervention to construct sewerage networks and connecting them to the main network that benefited 46,722 people. and conducted desludging of septic tanks in camps that benefited 534,716 people.
- At the same time, the members reached 676,449 people through solid waste management services.






