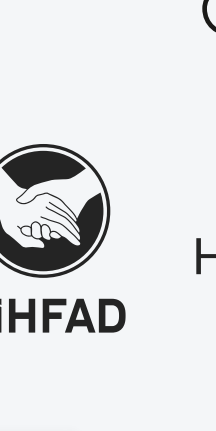

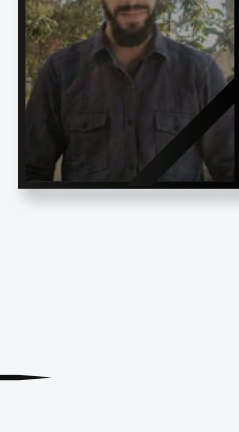

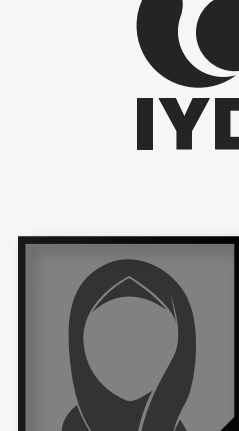


Big Heart Foundation

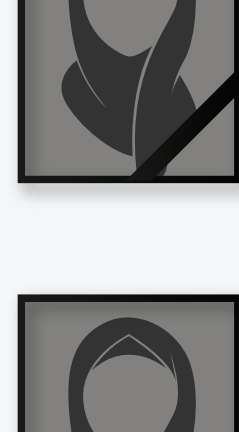

Hand in Hand for Aid and Development

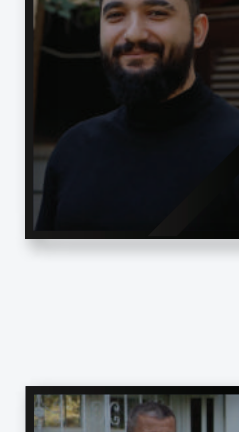

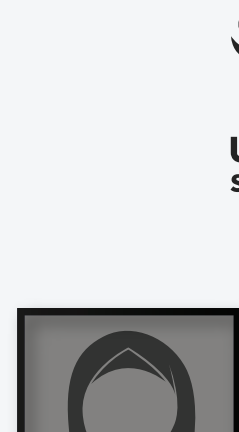

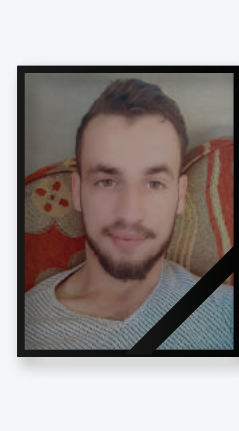


Ihsan Relief and Development



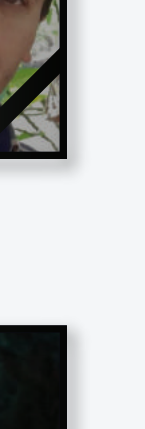

She, her daughter, and her sister died as a result of the collapse of the building her husband and other family members survived, but they had moderate injuries.

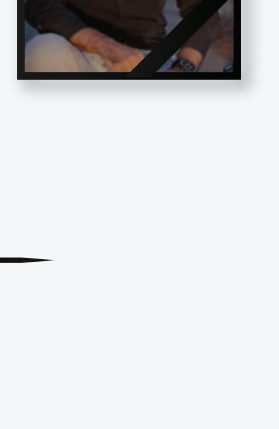

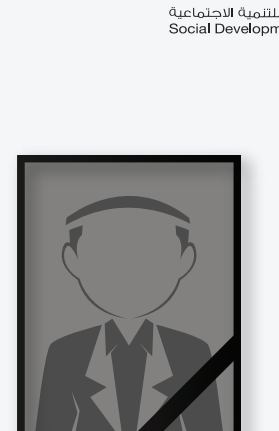

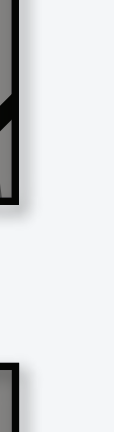


Intending to direct each of Orange's beneficiaries to participate in the initiative that best suits their needs, Ahmed Mubarak held in-depth counseling sessions with Orange beneficiaries and administered several questionnaires that measured the beneficiary's physical and psychological status, qualifications, and skills. These sessions often took additional time and lasted longer than expected because of the beneficiary's comfort and confidence in Ahmed, who used to devote a lot of time and effort to listening and evaluating the gaps in order to find the best and most appropriate solution to each beneficiary's needs. The main duty in Ahmed's work was to constantly communicate and interact with beneficiaries and frequently follow them up. Those beneficiaries haven't stopped asking Orange about Ahmed as of yet.

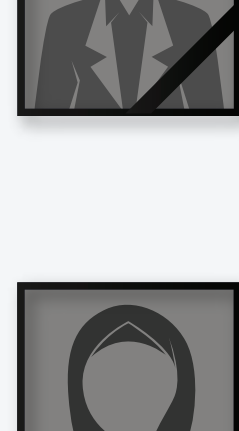

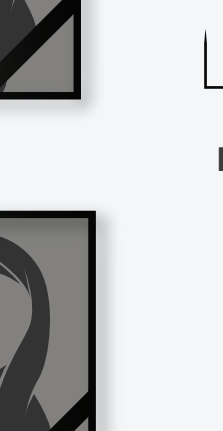

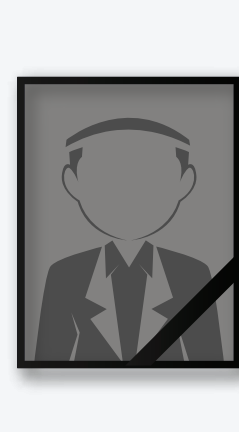


Karam Kayali Date of death: 6-2-2023 Location of death: Salqin – Suleikha street

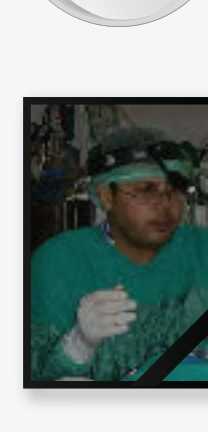


Takaful Al Sham Charity Organization

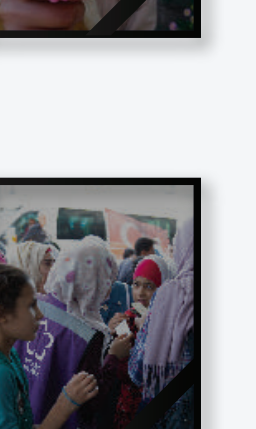

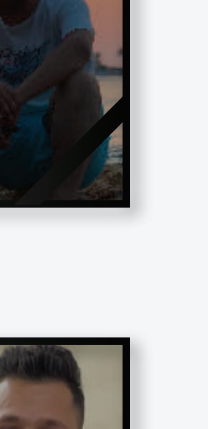

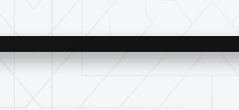
