

SNA EARTHQUAKE RESPONSE - SITREP#9 for August 2023


This report details the humanitarian responses of the Syrian NGO Alliance (SNA) members during June 2023, encompassing both the general response and the post-earthquake response. The report focuses on three sectors: Food Security and Livelihoods (FSL), Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH), and Early Recovery. The list of SNA members who provided response data for this report can be found in the footer of each sector.


This SitReps are the result of an ongoing collaboration between DEMAC and the Syrian NGO Alliance (SNA).

FOOD SECURITY & LIVELIHOODS (FSL)


- In August, members of the SNA effectively reached a wide array of beneficiaries through their FSL interventions, catering to various groups such as adults, children, individuals with disabilities, and female-headed households.
- 99308** households were reached encompassing **478100** individuals. assistance.. **453454** of these individuals were unique to the month of June while, the rest had received similar assistance in the previous month.
- Beneficiaries reached included **74%** Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) and **26%** mix of Host Communities & IDPs.
- To ensure that assistance provided aligned with the specific needs and contexts of the beneficiaries, both in-kind services and cash/voucher aid were utilized.




Total Beneficiarie by Delivery Modality



Number of beneficiaries varied by age and gender




Total reached by type of activity




EARLY RECOVERY


- SNA members conducted Early Recovery projects in 54 communities in Idlib and Aleppo Governorates.
- SNA members reached and assisted 3542135 new beneficiaries (directly and indirectly) during June 2023.
- Early Recovery projects have reached a total of 5006142 individuals, including 4332674 individuals benefiting from the Earthquake Response initiative, 334670 people reached through activities under Maintenance and Improvement of Equitable Access to Basic Services, 338558 individuals benefiting from enhanced access to Livelihoods and Job Opportunities and 240 individuals benefiting from strengthened social cohesion by empowering communities to lead early recovery processes together.
- An additional 298130 indirect beneficiaries benefitted from the overall improved conditions and infrastructure stemming from early recovery projects such as the rehabilitation of local markets/warehouses, road rehabilitation.




Total direct beneficiaries by sector objective increase access to livelihoods and job opportunities



Direct beneficiaries and #Indirect beneficiaries# by sector objective




Total direct beneficiaries by sector objective response to earthquake




WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE (WASH)

- SNA members responded to WASH needs and implemented WASH projects in 434 camps and 5 collective centers.
- Through the water infrastructure projects, SNA members reached 118,362 in water network rehab, 182,876 in operation and maintenance of water stations, and 144,192 through the chlorination of water.
- As most camps depend on water trucking, the members responded through water-trucking to 369,132 people and distributed 350 water containers.
- In addition, and as response to cholera outbreak, the members distributed hygiene kits to 71,307 people and conducted hygiene promotion sessions to 87,604 people.
- The members responded by sustainable intervention to construct sewerage networks and connecting them to the main network that benefited 10,416 people, and conducted desludging of septic tanks in camps that benefited 308,709 people. At the same time, the members reached 357,306 people through solid waste management services.


■ Aleppo Governorate
■ Idlib Governorate




Water Stations O&M
